GM Powertrain Show – Sylvania, OH - 9/8/14

This issue of our newsletter continues the periodic updates to our supporters now that the vehicle is completed and being displayed during the year. This project has been an all-volunteer effort that started in 1998 with the goal of restoring one of the twelve GM Futurliners, originally built in 1940, to its original and functional condition. The vehicle was donated to the National Automotive and Truck Museum by Joe Bortz in the early 1990's and is still owned by the museum in Auburn, Indiana. The restoration project was led by **Don Mayton** in Zeeland, Michigan with a group of nearly 40 volunteers participating from 1998 to 2007 when it was essentially completed. This devoted group continues to maintain and show this unique part of GM's history.

What's Happening Lately

- The Futurliner is a candidate for selection by the HVA as one of the very important vehicles in the history of the automobile and transportation. This would put the GM Futurliner on track to be listed on The National Historic Vehicle Register a significant achievement. The Futurliner was taken to Washington DC in early Nov (to get ahead of any bad weather) and to prepare it for the Jan 23-Feb 1 Auto Show. It is planned to be stored in DC thru May 2015. - NATMUS now has the capability of displaying the Futurliner inside. A new door has been installed and a location set aside. This winter though it is in Washington DC as described above.
