This 39th issue of our newsletter continues the semi-annual newsletters now that the vehicle is completed and being displayed during the year. This project has been an all-volunteer effort that started in 1998 with the goal of <u>restoring one of the twelve GM Futurliners</u>, originally built in 1940, to its original and functional condition. The vehicle was donated to the National Automotive and Truck Museum by Joe Bortz in the early 1990's and is still owned by the museum in Auburn, Indiana. The restoration project was led by volunteer **Don Mayton** in Zeeland, Michigan with a group of nearly 40 volunteers participating.

- This event commerates West Michigan's 100-year old love affair with the automobile, and features "15 miles of cool cars" on famed 28th Street through the communities of Grandville Wyoming Grand Rapids Kentwood and Cascade Twp. The 28th Street Metro Cruise® is presented and trademarked by the Wyoming Kentwood Area Chamber of Commerce and began in 2005. The Wyoming Kentwood Area Chamber of Commerce began the event to help bring business back to the 28th Street business corridor when M-6 expressway opened on the south end of Grand Rapids. The cruise has been held every August since 2005.
- The Futurliner will be at Harvey Cadillac/Lexus dealership, 2600 28th St SE. On Friday, it will be paraded up and down 28th street on the trailer. On Sat, there will be a continuous "parade" of unique cars up and down 28th St. and the Futurliner will be on display at the dealership.
